





Ceremony Formations

Receiving Line Formations


The receiving line may occur immediately after the ceremony in the back of the church, or weather permitting, outside. You may choose to have it at the reception site. This is a time for all of your guests to express their congratulations and best wishes to you, as well as meeting your parents and friends.

Traditionally the reception host (the bride's mother) leads the receiving line. Usually, the male attendants and child participants do not stand in the line. Each person should introduce themselves, and the person next to them in line if needed.




Bride's Mother, Father Groom's Mother, Father Bride & Groom Honor Attendant
